#### Costume Guidelines

Students will be wearing their costumes all day because of the carnival. Please follow these guidelines to make it comfortable for your child to wear his/her costume all day.

1. NO MASKS of any kind—not even partial Zorro type ones.
2. Avoid a lot of facial make-up—it itches and gets uncomfortable if they have

- to wear it all day.
