Slam Dunk Reading

The students are really making great progress towards our millionminute goal. They have already read 252,954 minutes. Wow!! Prizes are given to the individual classes for every 10,000 minutes. Many classes have already earned the first reward, and some have earned the second. Our highest class on each grade level: Pre-School is Mrs. Edwards, Kindergarten is Mrs. Anderson, First Grade is Mrs. Day. Many of the other classes are close behind! The top reader in the school each month will get to choose a bear. At 10,000 minutes the classes pick who they will target to dunk in May. Whichever class, on each grade level, that has the highest minutes will dunk the person of their choice. The minutes are calculated using the reading calendars that are sent home each month. Make sure to keep track and then return them at the start of each new month. Ask your student who their class is targeting to dunk...

We are so excited about how well the reading minutes have been accumulating. Minutes can be calculated by doing any Language Arts activity that is done at home. They can be calculated when the child is reading or being read to.
