Principals Message

Dear Parents,

The safety of our children while we are here at school is important to the Millard School District and to D.S.E.S. The state requires that elementary schools do the following kinds of drills each year: fire drills, earthquake drill, shelter in place drill, and violence drill. As an elementary school, we must practice a drill at least monthly (9 times). We will practice our earthquake drill during April which is the great shakeout in the state. We must also practice a violence and shelter in place drill.

Millard School District has a standardized way we conduct these drills with similar proce-

dures in each of the schools. However, one of the hardest drills that we practice is a shelter in place and violence drill in the elementary school. Even though it is a drill, it is very hard for young children to comprehend that there is really no danger. For that reason, we will practice this drill in a fun and non-intimidating manner – It will be called the Principal's Hide and Seek drill. Students will be taught to be quiet and not move to make sure that the principal cannot find or hear them!! Prizes will be given to classes who are not seen and heard. This allows us to practice this drill without upsetting our younger students. This will occur once for AM classes and

once for PM classes. We will count these two "Hide and Seek" games for those two drills.

These drills will occur during the latter part in the month of April. We thought we would give you, our parents, a heads up!! If they talk about the drill, please be careful about how much information you decide to share with your students. Our goal is to have them respond to what is asked of them by teachers during a time of emergency.

when the child is reading or being read to.

D.S.E.S. Class Placement for 2022-2023

Student placement for the 2022-2023 year will take place near the end of the current school year. Requests for specific teachers will not be taken, but there is a concern form if you feel that your child would perform better if separated from a particular student or if

there is a particular situation that would be important for us to know. Please do not assume that by talking to someone at the school that it will be remembered. Please pick up a form in the office, write or email your preferences by May 6, 2022 in order to give

us time to put your child in the best placement possible. Class lists will be available for 2022-23 1st graders at the end of the year. Kindergarten students will test and then put in classes the first week of the school year in August of 2022.
