## Principal's Message

Dear Parents,

Thanks for your support in keeping our students in school. We love having them attend and look forward to seeing them every day and watching how they progress!! It is important to have the students in school as much as possible to avoid gaps in their learning. This time of year many of our students miss school because of illness. We encourage you to continue following District guidelines to keep the students well and in school!!

Here are some tips on how to avoid illnesses:

1. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.
2. Stay home when you are

sick. If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands. You will help prevent others from catching your illness.

If you have a fever, please stay home for at least 24 hours.

3. Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

4. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.

5. Practice other good health habits. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work, or school; especially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically

active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.
