Christmas Around the World!

I will be taking a look at how a few other countries around the world celebrate Christmas.

Japan - Christmas takes place on the 24th of December instead of the 25th. They love to decorate their homes and give out presents to friends and family. For single women, Christmas Eve is a time to spend time with their special someone. Christmas is not a family occasion in Japan. Hotei-oshio is a buddhist monk who is seen equivalent to Santa Claus by the Japanese. Japan didn't really have Christmas traditions until 1974 when fast-food company KFC initiated a worldwide marketing campaign which offered fried chicken as a Christmas staple. Japan embraced this, and to this day, fried chicken is often eaten on Christmas day.

Italy - In Italy, Christmas is known as Novena and is a three week celebration. Poor children dress up as shepherds and go from house to house reciting poems, singing songs, and playing flutes. They have a strict fast the day before Christmas that ends 24 hours later with an elaborate celebratory Christmas feast.

Greenland - Everyone in the village gets gifts, and the children all go from hut to hut singing songs. This is one night that women are waited on by men. Everyone gets a strip of blubber wrapped in whale skin. People spend most of the night dancing. Another meal that is shared on Christmas is Kiviak, which consists of raw flesh of an Auk which has been buried in sealskin for several months.

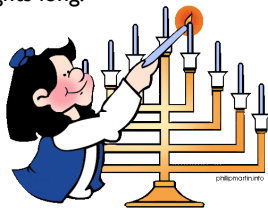
Finland - Christmas is celebrated from the 24th through the 26th of December, and the Christmas tree is always set up on Christmas Eve. On Christmas day, church starts at six in the morning. Christmas dinner includes roasted pig or ham, vegetables, and the main dish is codfish.

Russia - In Russia, Christmas is celebrated on the 7th of January. Christmas used to be celebrated on December 25, but was banned after the 1917 Revolution. In 1992, people started to celebrate the holiday again. The church in Russia still uses the old Julian calendar which is 13 days behind the Gregorian calendar, and this is why Christmas is celebrated in Russia on January 7th.

Other Winter Holidays

Hanukkah or (Chanukah) is the festival of lights, and is eight days and nights long.



This year, Hanukkah starts on the 6th of December and goes until the 14th. After the rededication of the Temple, the Jews were about to light a lamp. They noticed that they were left with little amount of oil which would last the eternal lamp only for a day. But to their surprise, a miracle occurred, and the oil lasted for eight days and nights until more oil could be brought from afar.

Hanukkah is celebrated by lighting a candle on the menorah to represent each of the eight days that the oil lasted, and many people like to get together and play games such as dreidel.

Kwanzaa- December 26-January 1

Kwanzaa, is an African-American celebration of cultural reaffirmation, is one of the fastest-growing holidays in the history of the world. Kwanzaa is not a religious holiday, but is a seven-day celebration. A Kinara is a candleholder, and each of its candles is lit to represent the principles of the holiday.



Kwanzaa is based on seven notable principles and ideologies such as Unity, Self Determination, Collective work and Responsibility, Cooperative economics, Purpose, Creativity and Faith.

Mawlid Al-Nabi

It's the festival that celebrates the birth of the Muhammad, the

Prophet. It is an event that has slowly grown and has spread throughout the Muslim world. It is an official holiday in all Muslim countries except a few.



People now celebrate by decorating Mosques with lights, praying the whole night before, and thousands of people gather together at places like Hazratbal in Kashmir, to have glimpse of the holy relics of the Prophet. This holiday is marked by Muslim gatherings, where stories, actions, bravery, wisdom and his final victory at Mecca about the Prophet are told. Mawlid Al-Nabi is the only Muslim festival that is celebrated in the day time.

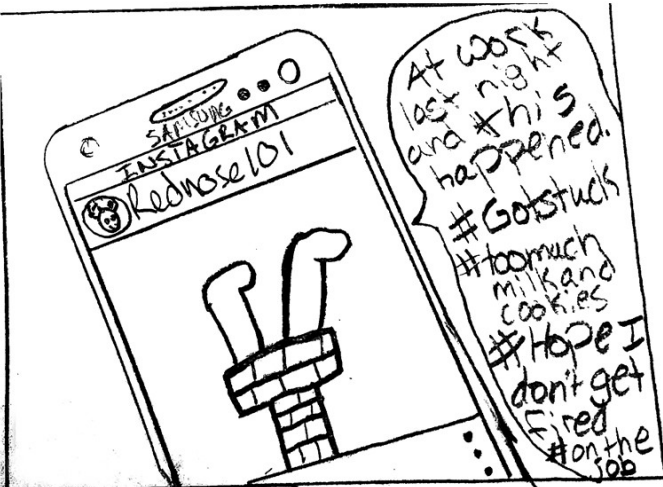
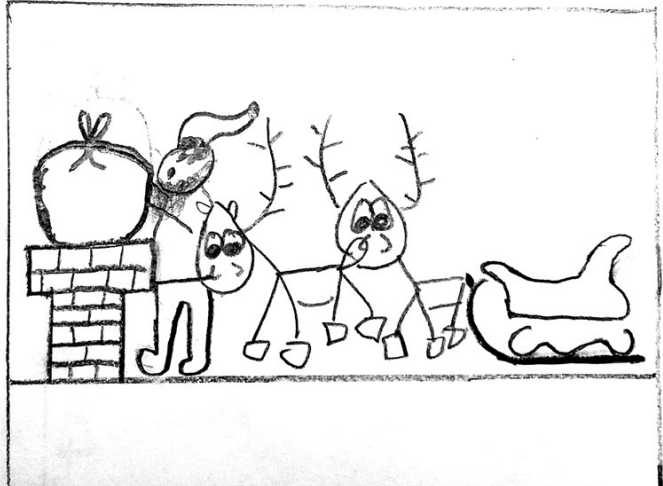
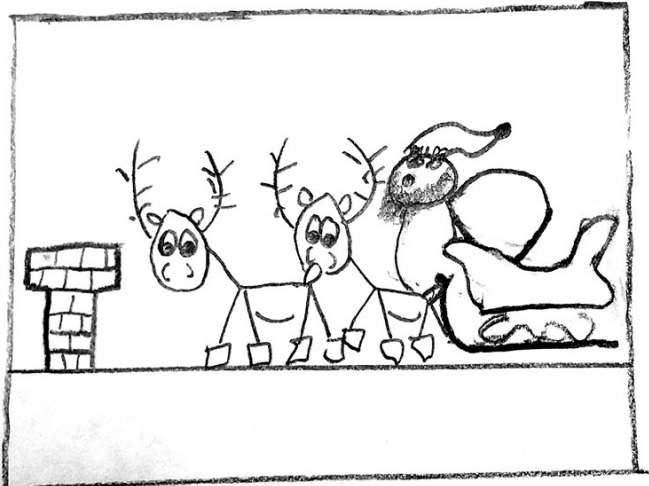
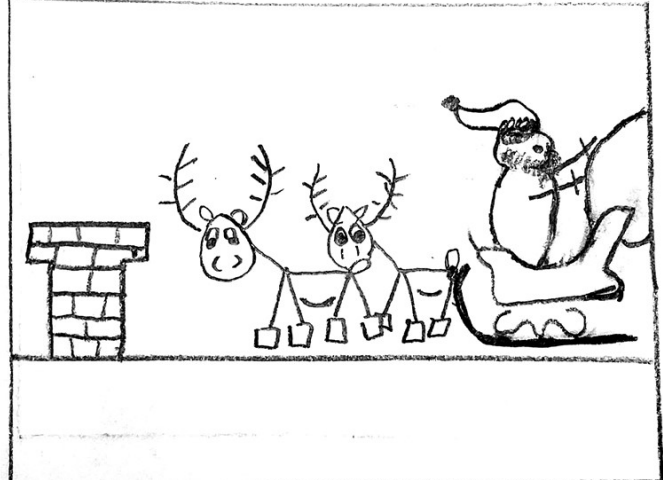
Dear Redacted,

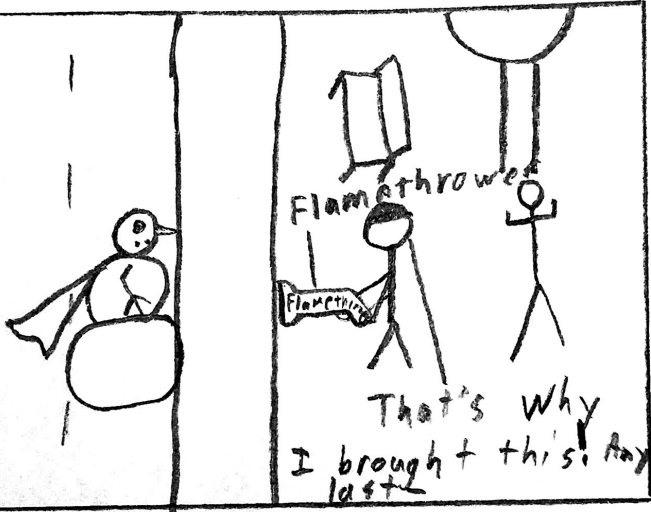
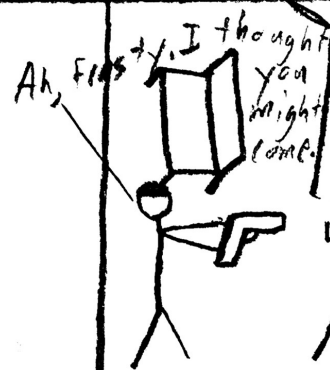
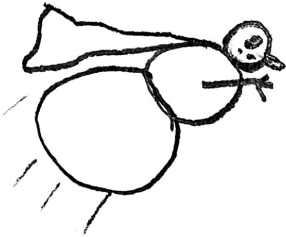
