Ernesto A: Yeah.

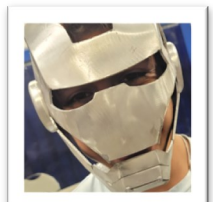
Aidan: Yeah.

This kind of eclipse is where the moon will center in front of the sun, making it look kind of like a circle of fire. Before this, on October 13th, a guest speaker who works for NASA named David Cheney visited the school to teach us about the solar eclipse. His presentation was very cool.

He taught us about different types of solar eclipses, such as total, partial and lunar eclipses. We learned a lot from him, and heard a lot of cool fun facts. 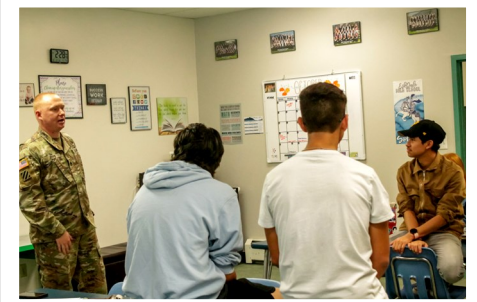
ARMY RECRUITER AT EHS

Britton: I know I'm not going with anyone

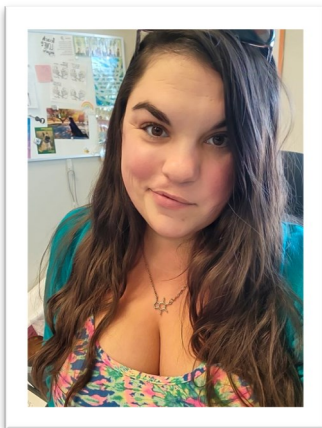
Stratton: I am not going to go, so yeah.
