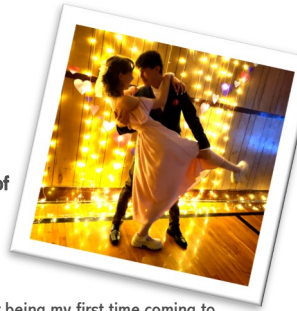
I went around asked people some questions about the dance.

Diego: I would if I had another year.

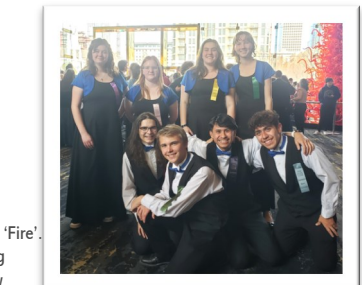
Neto D: Yes

Emma: I'm going to Arizona to visit family

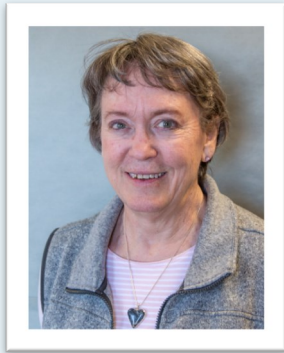
Britton: I have no idea.
