# Third Grade

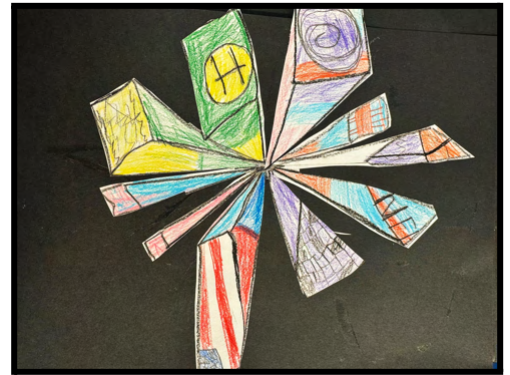

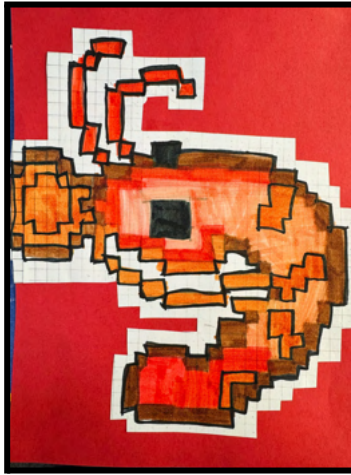


## Fourth Grade
