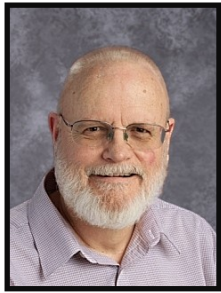




# Fillmore Middle School MUSTANGS

After retirement he plans to continue his passion in music on a much smaller scale—this time just for fun. He also enjoys photography and fishing. Mr. Crowe and his wife Christy have plans to move back to the great state of Wyoming where he has family and will spend time with them. All medication administration forms can now be found on the Millard school district webpage; millardk12.org for your convenience. This need to be completed by your child's primary health care provider.

Please bring in completed forms signed and dated by your primary health care provider with parent signature along with any required medications on the first day of school in August. Do NOT drop off medications prior to the first day of school as they will not be accepted. Parents must hand deliver medications with completed forms to the nurse or secretary in the office to be checked for full accuracy.

No medications will be administered at school without the accurately completed forms. Also, please **check the expiration date on medications as we cannot accept expired medications.**
