



Inconvenience #4 - Cohort

When someone tests positive, it is our job to identify possible exposures. A close contact exposure means a person was closer than 6 feet from someone who tested positive for 15 minutes or longer. If we are unable to determine who was in close contact with the person who tested positive, everyone in the classroom, bus, lunch or free period will be considered exposed and will be required to quarantine for 14 days. To avoid this, we will need to know where everyone is at all times of the day. This means that recess will be limited to a small cohort rather than the entire grade. We will assign cohorts to specific areas on the playground and in the lunchroom. Assigned seating will be the name of the game for all classes and lunch. Kind of a bummer, but way better than quarantining more people than necessary!

Inconvenience #5 - Hygiene

We are going to ask you to wash your hands much more than we ever have. It is expected that washing or using hand sanitizer will happen each time you exit and enter a room. We are also going to ask you to wash your masks at least once a week.

Discipline

We will follow the following protocol for students who refuse to comply with these expectations.

- 1st offense – teacher will handle
- 2nd offense – office referral, phone call home
- 3rd offense – parent meeting
