Motion to accept minutes for November 2, 2022, meeting Jessica Freeman, seconded by Kari Shields.

Mrs. Freeman applies for and thus far has received an ALEKS grant in Spring that helps fund our ALEKS program. This cuts costs by 33% in addition to free subscriptions.

Digital citizenship:

- Once a month for 45 min. increments someone will come down and teach 30–45-minute rotation.
- Lessons may be previewed on www.commonsense.org.
- Help kids learn / be aware of digital media.

Safety preparations:

- Mr. Teeples created binders to simplify safety plans.
- Front page – map of the school
- Binder will be accessible in every classroom in basket.
- First aid kits will also be included in the basket. (Possibility funding will be donated for first aid kits.)
- Emergency button may be pushed by anyone in classroom – everyone should be aware of the buttons location.
- Run / hide / fight drill was successful and informative – we saw some areas that needed work, and also where we did well.
- Kids realized during an emergency; off-limit locations are not necessarily off-limits.
- Water, granola, fruit snacks purchased in the event of an emergency.
- Bucket toilets / privacy tarps also purchased in case of emergency.
- Radio / earphone – reasoning being cell phones will most likely be unreliable / jammed.
- Group leader will hear status from 4-5 adults and then report all status to office staff.
- A couple of main first aid bags include rosters, plans, (MSD Emergency response) instructions, (including to hold, secure, evacuate, shelter in place, lockdown, run / hide.) Also include paperwork for reunification and release.
- January 17th, faculty meeting will host Andrea Stephenson along with a medical team that will do training for “Stop the Bleed.”

- Exit wounds generally cause more damage than dehydration.
- Will learn how to apply tourniquets, bandages, etc.
