Scholarship	Information
Golf Scholarship	For many, golf is more than a leisurely pastime. It challenges players, helps them to develop critical thinking skills and gets them outside and moving. It's seemingly a simple game, yet requires focus and technique to truly master the sport. And beyond the game itself, it brings together players from all different backgrounds and walks of life to create a community and network of people who can turn to each other when needed. To celebrate the game of golf and those that play it, the Scholarship for Golfers will award a student that plays the game in any capacity, either for their school or simply as a pastime. Students of any educational level are eligible to apply if they play golf in some capacity. To apply, write about your golf journey, including how you started playing, how you continue to play and why golf is important to you.
