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<u>United States Senate Youth Program</u>	The United States Senate Youth Program, established in 1962 by U.S. Senate Resolution, is a unique educational experience for outstanding high school students interested in pursuing careers in public service.

<u>Horatio Alger</u>	Juniors who demonstrate integrity, perseverance in overcoming adversity, strength of character, financial need, a good academic record, commitment to pursue a college education, and a desire to contribute to society.
<u>Medical Scrubs Collection Scholarship</u>	The Medical Scrubs Collection Scholarship will be awarded to the applicant with the winning submission for the thousand dollar question. When the deadline has passed, Medical Scrubs Collection judges will choose five to ten submissions that best fit the criteria for the MSC Scholarship question: What inspired you to pursue a career in helping others? The submissions of these finalists will be posted on Medical Scrubs Collection's website, where voting will be open to the public. The final winner will be determined by a combination of judges' scores and the number of votes.

<u>Utah Jumpstart Coalition Scholarship</u>	For seniors and is designed to recognize students who can demonstrate a solid understanding of financial literacy concepts and are pursuing a post-secondary education either at a university, college, trade school or similar institution of higher learning.

<u>Utah 1033 Foundation</u>	Junior or Senior. Applicants must be a child of a sworn Utah peace officer, actively employed on the date of application. Scholarships will be earned upon selection, and awarded upon enrollment in any accredited post-secondary institution within three years of the applicant's selection.
<u>USBE CTE Scholarship</u>	The Career and Technical Education (CTE) Scholarships and Tuition Awards are for outstanding CTE students in Utah. The scholarships/awards are sponsored by the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) with funds provided by participating higher education institutions. The award amount varies by institution. <u>USU Direct Admit Scholarship</u>	Direct admit a other scholarship provided by the business school to incoming freshmen. Students will automatically get this scholarship if they have either a 3.7 GPA, or a 28 ACT, or are in the top 10% of their graduating class, or if they have a 3.5 GPA and 24 ACT. If they meet just one of those requirements they will automatically be awarded the scholarship if they select a business major as their degree when they apply. The scholarship is worth \$500 and is due with the USU application for scholarships.

Those that are current high school juniors are welcome to apply. The cost of the Academy is \$1300 for all expenses of the 9 day Academy. Selected participants will receive a sponsorship packet, detailing how to raise money towards their \$1300 fee (monthly payments may also be arranged). Those participants who attend the entire Academy will receive 6 college credits and a 4-year scholarship to Southern Utah University.

<u>PathMaker Scholars</u>	PathMaker Scholars is a one-on-one mentored research experience for high school seniors and undergraduate students from underrepresented or marginalized backgrounds who are interested in pursuing careers in research, medicine, and education. Accepted students will live on campus and are provided with a \$4,000 stipend, housing, a meal plan, and a UTA pass for the duration of the program.

<u>Access Scholarship- The University of Utah</u>	ACCESS Scholars: Research & Scholarship Program Promoting Community in Science The College of Science ACCESS Scholars is a first-year program committed to eliminating barriers to STEM education and ensuring students of all backgrounds have the opportunity to succeed. Students must have a high school GPA of 3.5 or an ACT composite score of 26 and submit the required honors application in order to apply for this scholarship.
