Consistent with State and Federal guidelines, Millard School District ensures that all students residing within the jurisdiction of the District, including students with disabilities, birth through 21 years of age, who are in need of alternative language services, and/or special education and related services are identified, located, and evaluated.

The Millard School District Special Education Department and Alternative Language Departments destroy outdated records. Special Education records and Alternative Language Service records for students who were born in 1995 will be destroyed on June 1, 2022.
