Stacy Stott requested residency for Mauricio G. Chavira to live with her family and attend Millard High School as an 11th grade student. Mauricio was born in Arizona, previously lived with his family in Millard County and attended Fillmore Elementary School, and recently came from Mexico to live with the Stott's.

The Stott's have completed all the necessary paperwork to establish themselves as the responsible adults for Mauricio, however, they are requesting a waiver from paying the required out-of-state tuition (approximately \$13,500).

Member Lund made a motion to approve the residency request for Mauricio G. Chavira and waive the payment of the out-of-state tuition, seconded by Member Finlinson and carried unanimously by the Members of the Board.

School Vaping Lawsuit

Litigation -

School Vaping

Millard School District has been approached by Joel Wright, with the law firm of Kirton McConkie, who are partnering with the law firm of Frantz Law Group, APLC to join litigation against JUUL Labs, Inc. for the costs and damages imposed by illegal underage vaping. This is a nationwide lawsuit that many school districts have joined.

Joining in with this proposed lawsuit that has been reviewed by the Millard School District attorney, Paul D. Van Komen, who recommended that the District entertain the proposal pertaining to the vaping litigation.

The agreement with Frantz Law Group, APLC will be that twenty-percent (20%) of any monetary settlement or recovery that attorneys obtain from Millard School District and, twenty percent (20%) of the value of an non-monetary settlement or recovery, provided that such fee will be paid only by money recovered from Defendants. However, if money recovered from Defendants is less than twenty percent (20%) of the value of any non-monetary settlement or recovery, Millard School District will not be responsible for paying Attorney any money other than what has been recovered from Defendants. This is available if signed agreement by September 20, 2021.

This agreement may be terminated by the Millard School District at any time, with or without cause, by notifying the law firm of Frantz Law Group, APLC. Kirton McConkie will provide communication and assistance on the initial preparation of the federal litigation against JUUL Labs, Inc.

Member Finlinson made a motion to approve the Millard School District entering into the Legal Services Agreement on Vaping Litigation with the law firm of Kirton McConkie, partnering with the law firm of Frantz Law Group, APLC, for legal services in a lawsuit against JUUL Labs, Inc., seconded by Member Barney and carried unanimously by the Members of the Board.
